Long Range Goal:

All students will graduate college and career ready, and will demonstrate mastery in the Nine Graduation Competencies.

Priority:

All students will be on track to reach proficiency in ELA and math within three years or by grade 8.

Action Steps: Sustainability and Fidelity from 2016-2017

- 1. We will track the academic progress of each individual student and support interventions for success.
- 2. We will monitor standards aligned instruction, K-12, providing support and enriching the current foundation of instructional practice.
- **3.** We will support critical thinking, collaboration, communication, and creativity throughout instructional practice.
- 4. We will sustain our development of STEM enrichment and transdisciplinary learning opportunities.
- 5. We will support the use of data throughout the District to drive academic and professional growth.
- 6. We will support our school based mental health and behavior support programs.
- 7. We will articulate Pathways to College coursework, so all students can receive college credit and avoid remediation in post-secondary study.

Action Steps: 2017-2018

- 1. We will continue to review the scope, sequence and alignment of the K-8 Science program.
- 2. Upon SED adoption, we will begin the transition to the new K-8 ELA and math standards.
- 3. We will explore opportunities to offer coursework leading to certifications in the building trades.
- 4. We will build capacity to add AP Micro/Macro Economics and/or Human Geography coursework for 2017-2018.
- 5. We will continue alignment of High School programs with higher education opportunities and career pathways.
- 6. We will implement trauma informed schools strategies across our District and building-level systems and classrooms.
- 7. We will support the use of embedded instructional technology, including the i-Ready toolbox, e-Doctrina, Google Suite, and Chromebooks.
