

Federal Laws and Statutes

Assurances for <u>equal access</u> to educational opportunities are detailed under civil rights laws:

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation
 Act of 1973
 (commonly referred to as "Section 504")
 and
 Americans with Disabilities

Act of 1990 (ADA)

Who is eligible?


- Students who
 - have a documented disability,
 - identify themselves with our office,
 - complete a registration form and
 - submit appropriate
 documentation.

Documentation:

 must be provided from a qualified professional,

 must demonstrate an impact on a major life activity,


• and must be **current**.

We help to assure equal access by providing students with:

- auxiliary aids,
- support services,
- and reasonable accommodations.




Auxiliary Aids may include:

- Accessible computers and software
 - wheelchair access, Kurzweil, Dragon
- Alternative text
 - a.k.a. "Books on Tape", e-books, Braille
- Assistive technology
 - FM system


Support Services may include:

- Self-advocacy training
- Academic support
 - such as assistance with proofreading/editing work,
 - One-on-one writing assistance
 - AT (assistive technology) training
- Study Skills development
- Time management training and assistance



Classroom accommodations may include:

- Special scheduling
- Note taker
- Recorded lectures
- Interpreter




