DASA

New York State's Dignity for All Students Act (DASA) prohibits acts of harassment and bullying, including cyberbullying, and/or discrimination, by employees or students on school property or at a school function, including but not limited to such conduct those based on a student's actual or perceived race, color, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sexual orientation, gender (defined to include gender identity or expression), or sex (Education Law §12[I]). Cyberbullying is defined as harassment or bullying which takes place through any form of electronic communication (Education Law §11[8]).

Science

- The majority of students will be taking Living Environment (i.e. Biology) in 9th grade. The course culminates with the Living Environment Regents exam.
- A change from 8th grade is that NY State requires that all students in Regents level classes have 1200 minutes (20 hours), in addition to class time, for laboratory experiences.
- NY also requires that students submit satisfactory written lab reports upon completion of a lab. Students must complete satisfactory lab reports in order to take the Regents exam at the end of the year.

What is the IB Diploma Programme (IB DP)?

"Education for a better world."

- It is a rigorous, two-year program of study that leads to exams in six different subject areas and is aimed at developing global citizens and lifelong learners.
- The program offers a balanced, inquiry-based curriculum noted for its depth, challenge, and international perspective.
- Students also engage in community service, individual research, and an inquiry into the nature of knowledge.

Clean Technologies & Sustainable Industries

ECHS

- Provides high school students with opportunities to develop college and career readiness skills and pursue college coursework on a college campus with college faculty.
- Students participate in transdisciplinary problem based learning.
- 9th Grade students accepted into the program attended a Summer Bridge Program.
- 9th Grade students in the program will have an advisory on their schedule & English 9 Media Class.
- Students will visit the TEC-SMART Campus once a month in 9th grade.
- Pathways: Entrepreneurship & Innovation, Computer Information Sciences, Mechatronics, or Clean Energy.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD)

- The Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) policy is strictly instructional
- No devices smaller than a 7" screen are allowed
- Students must abide by the District's RUP
- The use of cellular data on student devices is prohibited
- Students without a personal computing device will not be at a disadvantage
- All students and staff will be web filtered
- District technology staff cannot troubleshoot personally owned devices

School Messenger

- The Ballston Spa High School is utilizing <u>SchoolMessenger</u> to notify families of school information and events mainly by email. In the event of a school closing or emergency, we will also use a text or phone call to provide information as quickly as possible.
- To receive text messages, parents first have to text the number 68453 to the system and then respond with the word "YES" from each wireless device they wish to receive texts on (otherwise the text is blocked by cellular companies).
- The High School is also using the system to place attendance calls in the event of a student being marked absent. Please be sure we have the most recent phone contact information and email address in your student(s) record. Parents also have the option to modify which messages they receive, and can choose how they receive messages, by setting up their own contact preference profile using School Messenger's <u>Contact Manager</u>.
