Kevin Schaefer called the Board of Education meeting to order at 7:03 pm.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Dragone thanked the SUNY Chancellor for visiting the ECS. He thanked the students and staff as well.

Dr. Dragone announced an ATC Grant award of \$2,500. He went on to announce several groups had received Global Foundries/Malta Foundation Grants including \$21,000 for engineering Education, Author Programs, and Robot Rumble.

Dr. Dragone voiced appreciation for the holiday spirit of giving to the district.

Dr. Dragone reminded all the next Board of Education Meeting would be held on Tuesday, January 5, 2016.

Budget Goals

Dr. Dragone reminded everyone of the district's mission, and discussed delivering of the mission including outcomes and core values, reminding all of the common core standards, that would be reworked, and the graduation competencies.

Dr. Dragone outlined the budget principles and guidelines and stated the framework of the district was determined by the mission, principles and guidelines and budget goals.

Dr. Dragone outlined the budget drivers including revenue and expenditures, he also outlined the tax rates per \$1000 assessed value over a 5-year period.

Dr. Dragone provided the Suburban Council 7-year average tax levy increase percentage.

Dr. Dragone gave historical State Aid as percentage of revenue and outlined the impact of lost assessed value of Global Foundries.

Dr. Dragone outlined the Regents State Aid Proposal and policy proposals and outlined the current politics in regard to State Aid.

He discussed the changes between the Federal and State decision making power. Dr. Dragone discussed the four dimensions of Federal Accountability and discussed the ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act) compromise bill. He presented an ESSA Summary regarding requirements.

Dr. Dragone shared the Common Core Task Force Report.

Dr. Dragone discussed enrollment projections. He discussed the continued downward trend, and shared historical kindergarten figures.

Dr. Dragone reviewed the 2015–2016 Budget Goals and discussed the crucial necessary maintenance. Dr. Dragone summarized the budget goals and discussed the continued focus of the work of the district.

Mr. Schaefer stated he knew the district would continue to provide the best possible opportunities for students because of the staff and administration. He voiced his approval of the programs supported by the district that were outside the traditional academic opportunities.

Dr. Dragone stated the district offered more opportunities than any other area schools, offering value for families in regard to college costs. He stated no other district was providing the number of opportunities for students, adding the district would continue to advance and grow because of the desire for continual improvement.

Nancy Fodera stated the Ballston Spa Educational Foundation raffle tickets for the Italy trip were available. She stated the drawing would be held on April 11th at the Taste of Ballston. Ms. Fodera stated the BSEF would have one granting session.
