


December Reads from Sora

We just got a bunch of new eBooks and audiobooks on Sora! Click the books below to borrow three of the new ones from Sora!




The Berry Pickers by Amanda Peters

Database of the Month

Gale in Context: Global Issues is a powerful database that sources information from 800 geographically diverse newspapers, magazines, and journals, including 334 newspapers from outside



the US. It provides teachers and students the ability to analyze important global issues and events through topic overviews, international viewpoints, news, and multimedia content. You can find this database on <u>Library.fyi</u> under "Social Studies." Check it out!

Did You Know?

California recently passed a bill mandating that all students receive instruction in media literacy, ioining Texas. New Jersey, and Delaware as a state with a media literacy law. As our lives become

more and more centered on receiving information through digital mediums, media literacy is as crucial for students to learn as all other forms of literacy. Part of my role as HS librarian is to provide explicit instruction in media literacy to students, as well as incorporate media literacy and media decoding skills into all of my lessons. 
